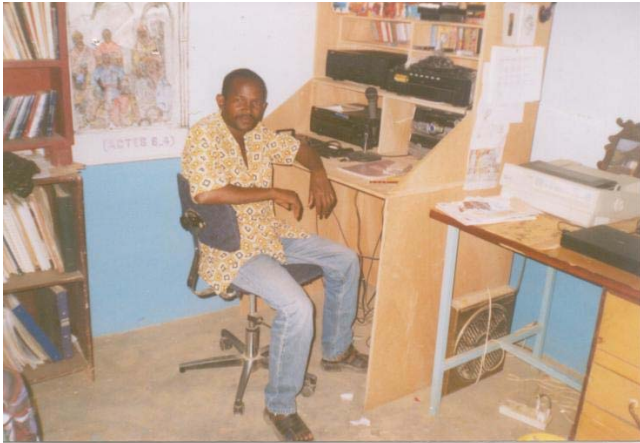

Dear family, friends and faithful supporters,

We want to express our appreciation to you for your faithful support of our family and ministry in Niger, Africa over the past ten years. God has taken us through some amazing adventures since we applied for missionary appointment in 1993. He has already accomplished more than we imagined possible in this Muslim nation. We are blessed to have had the privilege of serving the Kingdom at this time.

Shelley and I believe that this is just the beginning of what God wants to do. It is our desire, and that of our colleagues in this nation, to see a church planted in every city in Niger. We believe that it is possible to take the Gospel across this nation in the next ten years, should the Lord tarry his coming. The Christians and missionaries in Niger are praying for a revival that will make Niger a Christian nation. It is possible to reach this generation of Nigeriens. They are open and ready to receive the message of life.

We have been struggling financially for the past six months because of the weak dollar exchange against the Euro and African Franc. The dollar has dropped from 740 to 489 francs to the dollar. This represents a loss of 34% of our buying power. The cash that we had in our account in Springfield from our last deputational cycle has dissipated as we face over a \$1,000 deficit each month in our budget. We need for you to pray with us concerning this need. If you or your church can increase our monthly support or send a special cash offering to our account it would help us come out of this crisis. We do not want to have to return to the United States or close any present ministry outreaches because of finances before completing our service. We know that you will be obedient to the leading of the Holy Spirit and we believe that every need for the work in Niger will be met. It is not God's will that any Nigerien perish, but that all come to repentance. Thank you for praying with us for God's provision and for your continued investment in the Kingdom.
