Kombo Church

In February we hosted a team from Mechanicsville Christian Center, Mechanicsville, Virginia. The team erected a tabernacle and laid block for the Kombo church in Niamey. This church started under a tree in the yard of an elderly blind man who accepted Christ four years ago.



He explained to me that he had wasted his life pursuing wealth and a false religion. Now that he has become a Christian he told me that he can die in peace if God can use him to bring the gospel and a church to his community. He then donated half of his property for the church. The

congregation and community are very excited about the new building. We held evangelistic campaigns for children and adults after the construction. It was our privilege this past Sunday to baptize 5 new believers. The new church has 17 baptized believers and 40 children who attend faithfully. We thank the Lord for all that He is doing.



Good News Campaigns

Since our return to Niger we have held 6 good news campaigns and two children's crusades. During our time in the United States in recovery, the

Lord spoke to us about placing more emphasis on proclamation. We have 20 good news campaigns planned for this year. Please pray that each campaign will bear fruit. We are privileged in a predominately Muslim nation to have freedom of religion. Please pray that we will continue to enjoy the liberty of holding open air meetings. In February the first national Christian Fulani convention was held. The Fulani are an un-reached nomadic people group. Christian Fulani came from all over Niger to attend. Out of over 1 million Fulani in Niger there are only 45 Christians. We held evangelistic services every night in the public square of the village of Gueladio where the convention was held.

Back in Niger

We arrived back in Niger on January 11, 2005. We are thankful for all that the Lord has done for us and for all the support that we received during the time we were in the United States on medical leave. Brent will have to return in two years to have the hardware taken out of his leg, once the bones have completely healed.

Several hundred Christians were at the Niamey airport to meet us when we arrived. They sang and danced in celebration. We were touched by their love for us and we are thankful for the lives that have been touched by our ministry in Niger.

Since February, Shelley has taught a two week children's ministries course at the Bible School, held a one week puppet training for Master's Commission and completed a 40 hour teacher training program for the Goudel et Kouara Kano churches. Following each training program, the students held a children's crusade in one of our churches.
